California Petite Sirah had been grown across the state. It is believed to have been misnamed and is not related to Syrah from Persia. It is believed to actually be the Durif grape originating from the Rhone Valley of France. Petite Sirah first appeared in the Napa Valley in the 1880s. Today the grape has almost disappeared.

Our Napa Petite Sirah is made as rich, delicious, big and dark as we can make it without losing the distinct qualities of its French tradition. Our wine smells and tastes of violets, white pepper, dark fruit, cake and oak. It is surprisingly smooth with a long extended finish. This wine will continue to develop complexity for many years. It is the perfect wine when something more than a Cabernet Sauvignon or red blend is desired.

Cork finished. Approximately 600 six packs produced.
