City. From Whangarei proceed S.H.1  
approx 6km right onto Mangapai Rd,  
3km into Paparoa Rd, continue through  
to Paparoa-Oakleigh Rd to the town of  
Paparoa, turn Right, continue past the  
Hotel just left is Pahi Rd, follow to end  
of Rd. Plenty of free parking, boat  
leaves from Pahi Wharf.
