**Easter Overlay Cross** (Copper Foil Method)  
Create an Easter lily overlaid on a 5" x 9" cross ready to hand and brighten any room. Introduce yourself to pattern design, score and breaking glass, copper foil wrap method, tinning and lead soldering technique, a patina process, overlay points, ending with a finishing compound sealer and wax. Each person will need to bring safety glasses and a long sleeve "work shirt" or smock. Maximum participants- 3

**Birdhouse Gourds** **\$10**

John Martin 2 Hours

Celebrate Earth Day by creating an earth-friendly birdhouse from a gourd. An entry hole will be sized for a specific group of birds; the inside of the gourd will be cleaned out; drain holes will be added; a mounting cord will be installed. A simple wax finish will be applied, or the gourd shell may be left in its natural state for additional artwork or varnishing to be done at home. Each participant will leave with a birdhouse that is ready for nesting, as well as hand-outs about preparing and working with gourds. Several examples of completed birdhouses will be available to inspire your next gourd project.
