

# Travel Information

Travel insurance is not included in your tour package.

A passport is necessary for USA trips.

Please ensure your passports are with you and not packed in your suitcase.

If you are bringing medication with you, ensure it is in the original prescription bottle.

Fruit or beef is not permitted to be taken into the USA.

Baggage Handling is not included in our tour packages, but if you require assistance, feel free to ask a member of our staff. We will be glad to help you.

Have your name, address and telephone number on your suitcase and carry-on bag.

Only one large suitcase and one carry-on bag is permitted per passenger.

Suitcases are stowed under the bus and must not be locked for border crossing.

Please refrain from wearing strong scented products on the bus due to possible allergies.

Smoking on the bus is not permitted (this includes e-cigarettes).

Drinking alcoholic beverages is permitted on the buses, but it must be done responsibly and the passenger must be of legal age. Please remember legal age in the USA is 21 years of age and over.

Please keep all receipts from your US purchases in one place for Customs, on return to Canada.

Accommodations will not be made for those denied or detained for any reason at border crossings. No customer refund will be issued and the trip will continue.

## **What are we permitted to bring back to Canada?**

48 hours or more in the USA, your personal exemption limit is \$800 CAN, including duty free purchases.

**Alcoholic Beverages** are products that exceed 0.5% alcohol by volume. You are allowed to import **only one of the following** amounts of alcohol and alcoholic beverages free of duty and taxes, as part of your personal exemption:

### Alcoholic beverage limits

(While bottle sizes vary, the amounts listed are fixed.)

Product	Metric	Imperial	Estimates
Wine	Up to 1.5 litres	Up to 53 fluid ounces	Two 750 ml bottles of wine.
Alcoholic Beverages	Up to 1.14 litres	Up to 40 fluid ounces	One large standard bottle of liquor
Beer or Ale	Up to 8.5 litres	Up to 287 fluid ounces	Approximately 24 cans or bottles (355 ml each) of beer or ale.

You are allowed to import only one of the amounts listed in the table free of duty and taxes, as part of your [personal exemption](#).

**Tobacco Products:** If you are 18 years of age or over, you are allowed to bring in **all of the following** amounts of tobacco products into Canada free of duty and taxes within your personal exemption:

### Tobacco product limits

Cigarettes	200 cigarettes
Cigars	50 cigars
Tobacco	200 grams of manufactured tobacco
Tobacco sticks	200 tobacco sticks

If you bring in more than your personal exemption, you will have to pay regular assessments on the excess amount. These regular assessments can include duty and taxes, as well as provincial or territorial fees. When they calculate the amounts owing, border services officers will give an allowance for products that have an excise stamp **“DUTY PAID CANADA DROIT ACQUITTÉ”**.
