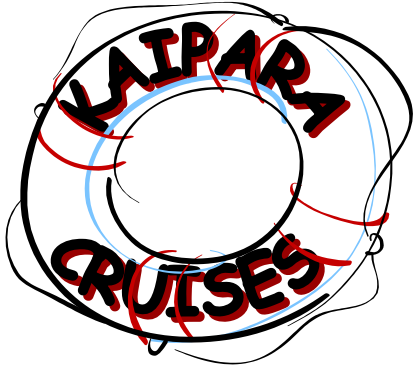


KAIPARA HARBOUR CRUISE TO DARGAVILLE A BOAT & BUS DAY TRIP WITH A DIFFERENCE

We invite you on a one day journey of discovery retracing the old steamer and sailing ship routes from Helensville to Dargaville through the historic Kaipara Harbour aboard our comfortable vessel, M.V. Kewpie Too and returning to Helensville by Coach.

Departing from Helensville, we make our way over sixty nautical miles cruising New Zealand's largest inland waterway from Helensville to Dargaville.

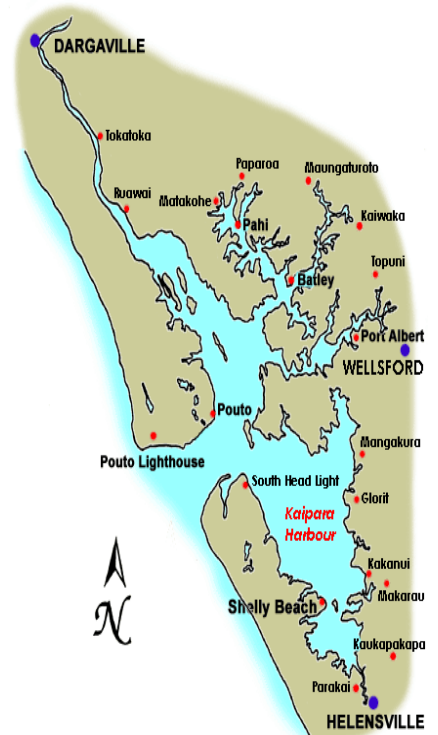
The first part of our journey is through the meandering Kaipara River, past Shelly Beach and into the expanse of the mighty Kaipara Harbour, you can almost reach out and touch the past as you examine the Kaipara's former life where more than a century ago, ships from many nations came to trade for timber, flax and gum.

Cruising to the tip of the South Kaipara peninsula, we then cross the Kaipara Heads to Pouto Point where you will see the magnificence of the two headlands with their white sandy beaches and the Tasman Sea beyond.

From the old marine station at Pouto Point we cruise past the many remote barren beaches many accessible only boat with their white sands back dropped with the green of newly planted pine forests.

From the Pouto Peninsula, we cruise into the Northern Wairoa River past many small towns and villages almost forgotten by time. We arrive at Dargaville late afternoon.

Once in Dargaville we join our air-conditioned coach for a relaxing journey back to your vehicle at Helensville.
